## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The present report provides details on the final disposition of the property of the United Nations Transitional Authority in Cambodia (UNTAC).

The assets, with a total original inventory value of \$232,010,300, have been classified under 16 categories as follows: vehicular equipment, prefabricated accommodation, communications equipment, generators, air support system, electronic data-processing equipment, furniture and fixtures, photocopiers, facsimile machines, upgrading of government buildings, military installations, bridges, water purification/bladders, containers, mine-clearing equipment and miscellaneous items.

Schedules I to V set out in annex I to the present report contain the disposition of UNTAC property, by category of assets, as follows: transferred to other missions/offices, donated to the Government of Cambodia, sold, losses owing to theft and written off.

The action to be taken by the General Assembly at its forty-ninth session on the liquidation of UNTAC, as contained in paragraph 14 of the present report, is as follows: the noting of the final disposition of the property of UNTAC.

#### I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. In paragraph 12 of its resolution 47/209 A of 22 December 1992, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to submit to the Assembly at its forty-eighth session the plan for the disposition of the assets of the United Nations Transitional Authority in Cambodia (UNTAC).
- 2. Pursuant to that request, the Secretary-General submitted his proposals for the disposition of the property of UNTAC in annex VIII to his earlier report on the financing of UNTAC (A/47/733/Add.1). In making his recommendations to the General Assembly, through the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (ACABQ), the Secretary-General had considered the factors set out below:
- (a) The continuing needs of other ongoing missions, such as the United Nations Protection Force (UNPROFOR), the United Nations Operation in Mozambique (ONUMOZ) and the United Nations Operation in Somalia (UNOSOM), as well as the continuing need to replace various items of equipment in long-established missions;
  - (b) The rehabilitation needs of Cambodia;
- (c) Current and/or acquirable absorption capacity of the Government of Cambodia, in terms of operation and maintenance and financial sustainability;
- (d) Implementation capacity of United Nations organizations and international and non-governmental organizations;
- (e) Cost-benefit of leaving equipment behind as opposed to its withdrawal, taking into account the options of selling or donating.
- 3. Taking the above factors into consideration, the Secretary-General proposed that UNTAC property be disposed of in the following manner:
- (a) Equipment that conforms to established standards or is considered compatible with existing equipment would be redeployed to other United Nations operations elsewhere in the world or placed in reserve for use by future missions;
- (b) Equipment that may be required for the start-up or expansion of United Nations agencies and international and non-governmental organizations operating in Cambodia and that cannot be kept in reserve in terms of subparagraph (a) above would be transferred to a relevant agency against appropriate credit to the UNTAC Special Account;
- (c) Commercial disposal under standard United Nations procedures within the country;
- (d) Any surplus UNTAC assets remaining after disposition of the items referred to in subparagraphs (a) to (c) above and/or any assets already installed in Cambodia, the dismantling of which would set back the

rehabilitation progress of the country, would be contributed to the Government of Cambodia. This refers, in particular, to airfield installation and equipment, bridges and mine-clearing equipment.

- 4. In paragraph 10 of its resolution 47/209 B of 14 September 1993, the General Assembly decided that the disposition of the property of UNTAC should proceed on the basis of the principle that the equipment of UNTAC should, wherever possible and cost-effective, be transferred to other missions, and in that connection endorsed the recommendation of ACABQ with regard to the disposition of the equipment and requested the Secretary-General to proceed with the disposition on that basis.
- 5. In paragraph 11 of the same resolution, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to submit a report at the forty-eighth session providing a detailed explanation for the donation of certain assets to the Government of Cambodia along with the proposals for the donation of any remaining assets that could not be transferred to other missions.
- 6. Pursuant to that request, the Secretary-General submitted a report to the General Assembly (A/48/701/Add.1) which provided details as to the status of the disposition of UNTAC assets as at 7 December 1993, including those that had been identified for consideration for sale or donation to the Government of Cambodia.
- 7. The present report provides details on the final disposition of the property of UNTAC.

# II. FINAL DISPOSITION OF THE PROPERTY OF THE UNITED NATIONS TRANSITIONAL AUTHORITY IN CAMBODIA

- 8. Annex I to the present report provides a summary table of the final disposition of UNTAC assets. Column 1 shows the original value of the assets, totalling \$232,010,300. Column 2 includes assets transferred to other United Nations missions and offices, valued at \$154,159,600. Column 3 consists of assets donated to the Government of Cambodia, with an ordinal inventory value of \$58,018,900. The total residual value of assets donated amounts to \$38,249,400. Column 4 consists of assets sold to various United Nations offices and agencies, private institutions and individuals, as well as those sold to the Cambodia Mine Action Centre (CMAC), with an original inventory value of \$8,113,300. The total residual value of assets sold amounts to \$6,074,600. Column 5 lists losses of assets owing to theft, amounting to \$8,089,700. Column 6 consists of assets written-off, amounting to \$3,628,800.
- 9. Schedules I to V provide a breakdown of the final disposition of UNTAC property, by category of assets, including the quantity and the original inventory value.
- 10. Schedule I lists assets that were transferred to other missions. Schedule II includes those assets that were donated to the Government of Cambodia. Schedule III lists assets that were sold to United Nations offices and agencies, as well as those sold to private institutions and individuals.

Schedule IV lists losses owing to theft. Schedule V summarizes assets that were written off.

- 11. Assets listed in schedule V include those items of equipment that were no longer serviceable owing to:
  - (a) Wear and tear when repair costs exceeded the value of its replacement;
  - (b) Damages caused by fire, floods, rain and acts of war;
  - (c) Accidents.

These cases were presented to the Local Property Survey Board of UNTAC for write off.

- 12. A graphical presentation of the distribution of the property of UNTAC is contained in annexes II and III.
- 13. The rationale used in developing the depreciation scales is presented in annex IV.

# III. ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AT ITS FORTY-NINTH SESSION

14. The action to be taken by the General Assembly at its forty-ninth session on the liquidation of UNTAC is as follows: the noting of the final disposition of the property of UNTAC.





# Depreciation percentage applied to the different categories of assets of the United Nations Transitional Authority in Cambodia

#### 1. Vehicular equipment

1. The life expectancy of vehicles is defined as follows:

## (a) <u>Category I</u>

Light vehicles Sedans, light and medium jeeps, light

trucks and minibuses

Life expectancy Five years or 120,000 kilometres, whichever

comes first

Percentage distribution 25, 25, 20, 15 and 15 per cent applied over

five years pro rata temporis per month

(b) <u>Category II</u>

Medium vehicles Ambulances, medium buses and trucks up to

4 tons

Life expectancy Eight years or 135,000 kilometres,

whichever comes first

Percentage distribution 20, 15, 15, 10, 10, 10, 10 and 10 per cent

applied over eight years pro rata temporis

(c) <u>Category III</u>

Heavy vehicles Heavy buses and trucks over 4 tons

Life expectancy 10 years or 250,000 kilometres, whichever

comes first

Percentage distribution 15, 10, 10, 10, 10, 10, 10, 10 and

5 per cent applied over 10 years pro rata

temporis per month

2. The applicable percentages are calculated with reference to the remainder value, i.e., category I, 25 per cent of the original value of the first year, 25 per cent of the remaining value the second year and so on. Consequently, there will always be a residual value.

3. The majority of UNTAC's 5,736 vehicles was received in new condition, even though some of them were manufactured in 1991. Therefore, the year of receipt, 1992, was used as the basis for applying the scales of depreciation described

above, and vehicles manufactured in 1991 or 1992 were depreciated from the date they were placed in service. Vehicles received from the other missions were depreciated based on their residual value at the time of receipt.

#### 2. Prefabricated accommodation

- 4. Because of factors like varying designs, methods of construction, various degrees of wear and tear and even damages from shrapnel and rocket propelled grenades, depreciation rates applied for prefabricated units ranged between 40 per cent and 85 per cent.
- 5. For the purpose of this exercise, a weighted average depreciation rate of 50 per cent was used to cover all categories of prefabricated units.
- 6. No depreciation factor was applied to units transferred to Somalia as they were unused (ATCO camps, valued at US\$ 11 million) and to a number of non-erected eight-man camps (34 MBS and 32 Ausco, valued at \$3.7 million).

#### 3. Communication equipment

- 7. The following depreciation factors were used for complementary, trunking and broadcast equipment with a recovery period of seven years:
  - (a) Equipment less than one year old: 14.29 per cent;
  - (b) Equipment more than one year old: 24.49 per cent.
- 8. Equipment received from other missions were depreciated based on their residual value at the time of receipt, but with a life expectancy of seven years.

#### 4. Generators

- 9. Generators were depreciated based on the following categories:
- (a) New generators 10 per cent depreciation. These generators are new and still packaged. However, due to the nature of the generators, their usefulness declines with storage because of dried seals, etc. As such, a 10 per cent depreciation rate was applied;
- (b) <u>Deployed generators</u> 10 per cent depreciation. These generators, although deployed, are heavy-duty and regularly maintained and serviced with new replaceable spare parts that extend their useful lifespan. Owing to their nature, regularly maintained generators are more useful than stored ones. As such, a 10 per cent depreciation rate was also applied to this category of equipment;
- (c) 5-kVA and below 20 per cent depreciation. These machines are light-duty equipment with a short lifespan, and the cost of repair is high

compared with their acquisition cost. As opposed to the larger generators, they are portable and suffer more damage. A 20 per cent depreciation rate was therefore applied.

#### 5. Air support equipment

- 10. Air support equipment consists of:
- (a) Mobile control towers, navigational aids and airfield lighting sets which were depreciated by 10 per cent;
- (b) Six locally purchased fire and rescue vehicles were depreciated according to the scale applied to vehicles, which is 7.5 per cent.

#### 6. <u>Electronic data-processing equipment</u>

- 11. Different rates were applied depending on the type of equipment:
- (a) Accessory equipment and software. For this category, a 30 per cent depreciation rate was applied. This equipment is usually used to upgrade, and/or attached to other electronic data-processing equipment. It primarily consists of additional memory chips, mice and computer cables;
- (b) Equipment slowly outdated. This category, including computer equipment which is slowly outdated by the computer market, was depreciated by 40 per cent. This equipment comprises primarily plotters, uninterrupted power supply units and voltage regulators;
- (c) Equipment quickly outdated. This category includes computer equipment which becomes quickly obsolete as new equipment is being produced and improved every year. These are desktop and laptop computers, monitors and scanners. Used equipment is rendered outdated immediately and was depreciated by 50 per cent. For unused equipment, a depreciation rate of 30 per cent was applied.

#### 7. Furniture and fixtures

12. As the furniture and fixtures are used in various degrees, the average depreciation rate was applied at 30 per cent.

# 8. Office equipment: photocopiers and facsimile machines

- 13. Photocopiers and fax machines were depreciated according to the following scales:
  - (a) Scale 0 No depreciation. These items are new or unused;

- (b) <u>Scale 1</u> 10 per cent depreciation. These items which were received in 1992 are less than one year old but were used continuously;
- (c)  $\underline{\text{Scale 2}}$  20 per cent depreciation. These items are more than one year old;
- (d)  $\underline{Scale\ 3}$  60 per cent depreciation. These are used items received from various United Nations missions.

#### 9. Mine-clearing equipment

14. This equipment consists of mine detectors which where depreciated by 30 per cent and of miscellaneous equipment and mine-clearing dozers, on which a 25 per cent depreciation rate was applied.

#### 10. Other equipment

- 15. The following depreciation rates were applied:
  - (a) Upgrading of government buildings 10 per cent;
  - (b) Military installations 50 per cent;
  - (c) Bridges 10 per cent;
  - (d) Water purification and bladder 20 per cent;
  - (e) Containers 30 per cent;
  - (f) Miscellaneous 30 per cent.
