## Corrigendum

Paragraph 2 of the reply of Qatar should read

2. Qatar therefore believes that the membership of the Security Council must be increased so as to make the Council more representative of the international community in the exercise of its extensive powers under the Charter. If it was reasonable in 1963 that the Council should be composed of 15 members out of a total membership of just over 100, the current membership of the General Assembly, which totals nearly 200, makes it necessary to expand the membership of the Security Council, perhaps not in the same proportion but, at all events, to more than 15.
