ELECTIONS TO FILL VACANCIES IN SUBSIDIARY ORGANS AND OTHER ELECTIONS

Election of twelve members of the World Food Council

## Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. The General Assembly, in paragraph 8 of its resolution 3348 (XXIX) of 17 December 1974, decided that the World Food Council should consist of 36 members to be nominated by the Economic and Social Council and elected by the Assembly for a term of three years, taking into consideration balanced geographical representation, with one third of the members retiring every year and the retiring members being eligible for re-election. The term of the following members expires on 31 December 1993: Bangladesh, Bulgaria, Canada, China, Colombia, Gambia, Kenya, Lesotho, Mexico, Nepal, Turkey and United States of America.
- 2. By its decision 1993/218, the Economic and Social Council, acting in pursuance of paragraph 8 of General Assembly resolution 3348 (XXIX), decided to nominate the following States for election by the Assembly to membership in the World Food Council:
  - (a) African States (three vacancies): Liberia, Malawi and Sudan;
  - (b) Asian States (three vacancies): Bangladesh, China and Pakistan;
- (c) <u>Latin American and Caribbean States</u> (two vacancies): Brazil and Mexico;
- (d)  $\underline{\text{Western European and other States}}$  (three vacancies): Turkey and United States of America.
