ORGANIZATION OF WORK

Note by the Secretariat

1. In order to assist the Sixth Committee in the organization of its work, the Secretariat finds it appropriate, in the light of General Assembly resolutions 1898 (XVIII) of 11 November 1963 and 32/71 of 9 December 1977 and of rule 99 (b) of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, to draw the Sixth Committee's attention to the following.

I. ITEMS ALLOCATED TO THE SIXTH COMMITTEE

2. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 24 September 1993, the General Assembly decided to allocate to the Sixth Committee 12 items. The titles of these items and their numbers are reproduced in the letter dated 24 September 1993 from the President of the Assembly addressed to the Chairman of the Sixth Committee (A/C.6/48/1).

II. DOCUMENTATION RELATING TO THE ITEMS ALLOCATED TO THE SIXTH COMMITTEE

3. The following table lists the documents of the forty-eighth session of the General Assembly relating to the items allocated to the Sixth Committee. 1/ It includes references to the reports of commissions or committees and the reports which are to be submitted by the Secretary-General pursuant to resolutions or decisions of preceding sessions of the Assembly, as well as to the documents circulated under the agenda items allocated to the Sixth Committee, in accordance with requests of Member States. The items are arranged in the order in which they appear in the letter dated 24 September 1993 from the President of the Assembly to the Chairman of the Sixth Committee (A/C.6/48/1).

III. DATE FOR CONCLUDING THE WORK OF THE COMMITTEE, ORDER AND APPROXIMATE DATES OF CONSIDERATION OF ITEMS

4. Rule 99 (b) of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly provides that:

"Each Main Committee, taking into account the closing date for the session fixed by the General Assembly on the recommendation of the General Committee, shall adopt its own priorities and meet as may be necessary to complete the consideration of the items referred to it. It shall at the beginning of the session adopt a programme of work indicating, if possible, a target date for the conclusion of its work, the approximate dates of consideration of items and the number of meetings to be allocated to each item."

5. At its 1st meeting, on 22 September 1993, the General Committee decided to recommend that the forty-eighth session should recess not later than Tuesday, 21 December 1993 and conclude on Monday, 19 September 1994. Under the circumstances, it appears advisable that the Sixth Committee should arrange its schedule of meetings in such a way that it will conclude its work not later than Friday, 26 November 1993.

6. Taking into account the pattern followed by the Committee in the order of consideration of items at recent sessions of the General Assembly, the Sixth Committee may wish to consider, for the purpose of adopting its programme of work, the following timetable, drawn up on the basis of previous programmes of work adopted by the Committee, which indicates approximate dates of consideration of the agenda items referred to it.

The Sixth Committee may therefore wish to keep to a minimum the number of meetings it will hold during that period.

** Informal consultations of the Secretary-General on outstanding issues relating to the deep seabed mining provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea are scheduled to take place during the week of 8 to 12 November 1993.

IV. ESTABLISHMENT OF WORKING GROUPS AND HOLDING OF CONSULTATIONS

7. In connection with the establishment of subcommittees or working groups and the holding of consultations for the purpose of facilitating the work, it should be borne in mind that the General Assembly took the following decisions at its forty-sixth and forty-seventh sessions:

(a) Concerning agenda item 141 (Progressive development of the principles and norms of international law relating to the new international economic order), the General Assembly decided to establish a working group of the Sixth Committee to develop the principles and norms of international law relating to the new international economic order (resolution 46/52 of 9 December 1991);

(b) As regards agenda item 142 (United Nations Decade of International Law), the General Assembly requested the Working Group on the United Nations Decade of International Law to continue its work at the forty-eighth session in accordance with its mandate and methods of work (resolution 47/32 of 25 November 1992);

(c) With respect to agenda item 147 (Convention on jurisdictional immunities of States and their property), the General Assembly decided to re-establish at its forty-eighth session, in the framework of the Sixth Committee, the Working Group established at the forty-seventh session, to continue consideration of (i) issues of substance arising out of the draft articles, in order to facilitate the successful conclusion of a convention through the promotion of general agreement; and (ii) the question of the convening of an international conference, to be held in 1994 or subsequently, to conclude a convention on jurisdictional immunities of States and their property, on the understanding that at the beginning of the forty-eighth session the Working Group will devote two weeks, at least 10 to 12 meetings, starting from 27 September 1993, to concentrated work (decision 47/414 of 25 November 1992).

8. Since the conference services to be provided for meetings of working groups and for the holding of informal consultations are those allocated to the Sixth Committee, it is important that such meetings and consultations be held in place of, rather than in addition to, meetings of the Committee.

V. DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF DRAFT RESOLUTIONS
WITH FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

9. According to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, "no resolution involving expenditure shall be recommended by a committee for approval by the General Assembly unless it is accompanied by an estimate of expenditures prepared by the Secretary-General". It is therefore imperative that the Main Committees allow sufficient time for the preparation of the estimates of expenditures by the Secretariat and for their consideration by the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions and by the Fifth Committee. Under the circumstances, if Friday, 26 November 1993, is accepted as the concluding date for the work of the Sixth Committee (see para. 5 above), Wednesday, 10 November 1993, would have to be considered as the mandatory deadline for submission to the Fifth Committee of draft resolutions with financial implications.

VI. CONFERENCE RESOURCES AVAILABLE

10. The available conference facilities will, in principle, enable the Committee to hold an average of five to six meetings per week; normally, morning meetings will be held from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and afternoon meetings from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.

11. In order to avoid difficulties in the organization of meetings of regional groups of the Committee, it is suggested that all requests for such meetings be channelled to the Planning and Meetings Services Section through the Secretary of the Committee.
