PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1980-1981

REPORT OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON ENHANCING THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PRINCIPLE OF NON-USE OF FORCE IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

Administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution contained in document A/C.6/35/L.6/Rev.1

Statement submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance with rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly

1. The Sixth Committee, at its 40th meeting held on 6 November 1980, adopted the draft resolution contained in document A/C.6/35/L.6/Rev.1. It had before it a statement of financial implications (A/C.6/35/L.8).

2. Under the terms of the draft resolution contained in document A/C.6/35/L.6/Rev.1, the General Assembly would, inter alia:

(a) Decide that the Special Committee shall continue its work with the goal of drafting, at the earliest possible date, a world treaty on the non-use of force in international relations as well as the peaceful settlement of disputes or such other recommendations as the Committee deems appropriate;

(b) Invite the Governments which have not yet done so to communicate their comments or suggestions or to bring them up to date, in accordance with General Assembly resolution 31/9;

(c) Request the Secretary-General to provide the Special Committee with the necessary facilities and services.

3. On the basis of the above, conference servicing costs are estimated hereunder using the following assumptions:

(a) The Special Committee would meet for four weeks in New York from 23 March to 17 April 1981 and hold two daily meetings;

(b) Services for pre-session documentation, in-session documentation, and interpretation would be provided in five languages (Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish); however, post-session documentation consisting of the Special Committee's report to the General Assembly would be in six languages.
