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ISRAELI NUCLEAR ARMAMENT

Report of the Secretary-General

1. On 9 December 1992, the General Assembly adopted resolution 47/55, the operative part of which reads as follows:

"The General Assembly,

" . . .

"1. <u>Deplores</u> Israel's refusal to renounce possession of nuclear weapons;

"2. <u>Urges</u> Israel to accede to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons;

"3. <u>Reaffirms</u> that Israel should promptly apply Security Council resolution 487 (1981) in which the Council, <u>inter alia</u>, requested it to place all its nuclear facilities under International Atomic Energy Agency safeguards and to refrain from attaching or threatening to attack nuclear facilities;

"4. <u>Calls upon</u> all States and organizations not to cooperate with or give assistance to Israel with the aim of enhancing its nuclear-weapons capability;

"5. <u>Requests</u> the International Atomic Energy Agency to inform the Secretary-General of any steps Israel may take to place its nuclear facilities under Agency safeguards;

"6. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to follow closely Israeli nuclear activities and to report thereon to the General Assembly at its forty-eighth session;

"7. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-eighth session the item entitled 'Israeli nuclear armament'."

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2. This report is being submitted pursuant to paragraph 6 of the resolution above. However, apart from the material received from the International Atomic Energy Agency (see annex below), no additional information has been forwarded to him since the submission of the last report on the subject (A/47/538) to the General Assembly at its forty-seventh session.

Resolution GC(XXXVII)RES/627 of 1 October 1993 of the General Conference of the International Atomic Energy Agency

Application of IAEA safeguards in the Middle East

The General Conference

 (a) <u>Recognizing</u> the importance of the non-proliferation of nuclear weapons - both globally and regionally - in enhancing international peace and security,

(b) <u>Mindful</u> of the usefulness of the Agency's safeguards system as a reliable means of verification to ensure the promotion of peaceful uses of nuclear energy,

(c) <u>Concerned</u> by the grave consequences, endangering peace and security, of the presence in the Middle East region of nuclear activities not wholly devoted to peaceful purposes,

(d) <u>Welcoming</u> the initiatives regarding the establishment of a zone free of all weapons of mass destruction, including nuclear weapons, in the Middle East and recent initiatives regarding arms control in the region,

(e) <u>Commending</u> the efforts of the Agency concerning the application of safeguards in the Middle East, including its recent organization of a workshop on "The Modalities for the Application of Safeguards in a Future Nuclear-Weapon-Free-Zone in the Middle East", and the positive response of some States in concluding a full-scope safeguards agreement, and

(f) <u>Recalling</u> its resolution GC(XXXVI)RES/601,

1. <u>Takes note</u> of the Director-General's report in document GC(XXXVII)1072 and the proposals contained therein;

2. <u>Affirms</u> the urgent need for all States in the Middle East to forthwith accept the application of full-scope Agency safeguards to all their nuclear activities as an important confidence-building measure among all States in the region and as a step in enhancing peace and security in the context of the establishment of a nuclear-weapon-free zone (NWFZ);

3. <u>Calls upon</u> all parties directly concerned to consider seriously taking the practical and appropriate steps required for the implementation of the proposal to establish a mutually and effectively verifiable NWFZ in the region, and invites the countries concerned to adhere to international non-proliferation regimes, particularly the nuclear non-proliferation regime, as a means of complementing participation in a zone free of all weapons of mass destruction in the Middle East and of strengthening peace and security in the region; A/48/494 English Page 4

4. <u>Takes note</u> of the importance of the ongoing bilateral Middle East peace negotiations and the activities of the multilateral working group on Arms Control and Regional Security in promoting mutual confidence and security in the Middle East, including establishment of a NWFZ, and calls on the Director-General, as requested by the participants, to render all necessary assistance to the working group in promoting that objective;

5. <u>Requests</u> the Director-General, on the basis of his report contained in document GC(XXXVII)/1072, to continue consultations with the States of the Middle East to facilitate the early application of full-scope Agency safeguards to all nuclear activities in the region as relevant to the preparation of model agreements, as a necessary step towards the establishment of a NWFZ in the region, referred to in resolution GC(XXXVI)RES/601;

6. <u>Calls upon</u> all States in the region to extend their fullest cooperation to the Director-General in the fulfilment of the tasks entrusted to him in the preceding paragraph;

7. <u>Further calls upon</u> all States in the region to take measures, including confidence-building and verification measures, aimed at establishing a NWFZ in the Middle East;

8. <u>Calls upon</u> all other States, especially those with a special responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security, to render all assistance to the Director-General by facilitating the implementation of this resolution; and

9. <u>Requests</u> the Director-General to submit to the Board of Governors and to the General Conference at its thirty-eighth regular session a report on the implementation of this resolution and to include in the provisional agenda for that session an item entitled "Application of IAEA safeguards in the Middle East".
