Statement concerning the lifting of sanctions against South
Africa issued on 27 September 1993 by the Ministry of
Foreign Affairs of Singapore

The President of the African National Congress (ANC), Nelson Mandela, has, in his address to the United Nations Special Committee against Apartheid on 24 September 1993, called for the lifting of all economic sanctions against South Africa.

In the light of this announcement and the recent encouraging developments in South Africa, the Government of Singapore will lift the remaining restriction on banking transactions involving financial and development loans to the Government of South Africa.

The arms embargo against South Africa will continue to be enforced as required under Security Council resolutions 421 (1977) and 558 (1984).
