PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1980-1981

First performance report

Report of the Secretary-General

- 1. The present report, which proposes adjustments to the 1980-1981 appropriations, reflects primarily, pursuant to established policy, variations in the rates of exchange, the impact of inflation, and decisions of policy-making organs the implementation of which could not be deferred to the 1982-1983 biennium.
- 2. Detailed information in respect of rates of exchange and price indices, based on actual experience at all duty stations during the first ll months of the biennium, have been collected, examined and compared with those which were assumed for the purpose of the 1980-1981 appropriations.
- 3. In examining the level of resources required to implement the 1980-1981 programmes, attention was given not only to the adverse impact of changes in inflation and exchange rates on the initial appropriations but also to the need to determine the minimum additional resources which would be required at this stage without creating serious cash shortages.

Effects of changes in the rates of exchange and of inflation

4. Attached to the present report are four tables. Tables 1 and 2 analyse the movement, both actual and projected of rates of exchange and of inflation since the start of the current biennium, while tables 3 and 4 indicate the effect of these changes on the post adjustment system applicable to staff in the Professianal category and above and on General Service salary rates. It should be noted that on the basis of a detailed examination of the effect of these changes the Secretary-General has not applied an average rate of inflation to all objects of expenditure. Thus, a higher-than-average inflation rate had to be applied to travel costs at all duty stations and to the costs of rental of premises, utilities and communications in New York, Geneva and Addis Ababa. In the case of Addis Ababa, the requirement indicated for inflation in annex I to the present

report includes the cost of rental allowances paid to staff in 1980 as compensation for rent increases, pending an adjustment of the applicable post adjustment on the basis of an International Civil Service Commission (ICSC) salary survey which took place in October 1980.

As indicated in annex I, the net additional requirements attributable to the effect of changes in the rates of exchange and/or of inflation, based on the rates indicated in table 1, are estimated at \$91,161,700 gross (\$17,603,300 due to rates of exchange and \$73,558,400 to inflation) and \$78,810,700 net (\$15,727,900 due to rates of exchange and \$63,082,800 to inflation). The detailed breakdown of these figures, by section and category, is also shown in annex I.

Decisions of policy-making organs

The following gross requirements totalling \$1,440,400 relate to the implementation of decisions of policy-making organs which could not be deferred to the 1982-1983 biennium or to the final performance report at the end of 1981:

Section 1. Over-all policy-making, direction and co-ordination (\$396,800)

(a) Eleventh special session of the General Assembly concerning development and international economic co-operation:

Savings and other changes

- Under this heading are included factors which, in the main, counterbalance the effects of inflation and exchange-rate variations and also a limited number of cases where additional requirements are needed.
- Gross savings and other changes, resulting in a total offset of \$39,427,200, are estimated, and result primarily from the vacancy rate in established posts which has been altogether higher than originally assumed; from a decrease in the requirements for common staff costs in respect of the Economic Commission for Latin America (sect. 12), and from the delay in the construction project in Nairobi, 1/ for which it is now estimated that only \$2,690,000 will be required in addition to the carryover from the previous biennium. Accordingly, it is proposed that the initial appropriation for the current biennium for this purpose be reduced by \$12,500,000 (sect. 32); any further adjustments necessary during 1981 will be reported in the Secretary-General's progress report to the thirty-sixth session and included in the Secretary-General's performance report next vear.
- It should be noted that higher than anticipated common staff costs have been experienced for the World Food Council (sect. 1) and the Economic Commission for Africa (sect. 13).

10. Additional requirements in the amount of \$2,326,600 were included under this heading as described below under the relevant sections.

Section 1. Over-all policy-making, direction and co-ordination

(a) United Nations Joint Staff Pension Board:

Due to an oversight during 1979, the United Nations contribution to the expenses of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund for that year was not obligated and resources appropriated for the purpose were surrendered. In order to meet this obligation, an additional amount of \$492,700 is required.

(b) Office of the Co-ordinator of Assistance for the Reconstruction and Development of Lebanon:

At the time of the establishment of the Office of the Co-ordinator, it was expected that accommodation and facilities would be provided within existing United Nations premises. Such accommodation was provided initially but was withdrawn due to other commitments in the Office concerned. Consequently, the Co-ordinator has been accommodated in a building for which commercial rental must be paid. The associated cost for the biennium is estimated at \$27,000.

Section 2. Political and Security Council Affairs: peace-keeping activities

- (a) Special missions approved by the Secretary-General under the provisions of General Assembly resolution 34/231 on unforeseen and extraordinary expenses for the biennium 1980-1981 relating to the maintenance of peace and security, amounting to \$484,500 for travel and related costs as follows:
 - (i) Commission of Enquiry into the situation in Iran (\$375,000)
 - (ii) Peace-keeping operation in Chad (\$5,000)
 - (iii) Situation concerning Malta and Libya (\$4,500)
 - (iv) Mission to facilitate communications between Iran and Iraq (\$100,000)
 - (b) United Nations Military Observer Group in India and Pakistan (UNMOGIP):

Provision for the rental of an aircraft in the current budget was based on a one year (1978) estimated expenditure. It has proved necessary to arrange for the commercial rental of an aircraft instead of obtaining one from a Government. The possible need for additional requirements has been acknowledged by the ACABQ in its first report on the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981 (document A/34/7, para. 2.28). An additional amount of \$362,800 is required for such commercial rental.

Section 25. International Court of Justice

An additional amount of \$819,800 is required in connexion with pensions for the survivors of two deceased judges (\$122,100), salaries of judges based on a cost-of-living adjustment in January 1980 (\$255,200) and general temporary assistance arising from the increased workload of the Court in 1980 (\$442,500).

Section 28. Administration, management and general services

Two proposed increases totalling \$139,800 are included under this section as follows:

(i) Contributions to jointly financed activities:

The Administrative Committee on Co-ordination (ACC) has agreed to the establishment of an interagency fund to provide for measures to be taken in the event of security emergencies in countries other than those in which United Nations organizations have their headquarters. The fund has been established effective 1 January 1981 in an amount of \$400,000 of which \$220,000 would serve to bring together a basic inventory of radio communications equipment and \$180,000 would be available to meet operating costs. The fund would be administered by the Secretary-General's Co-ordinator for Security Matters. Expenditures made from the fund (e.g. for evacuation of staff) will be reimbursed by the agencies of the Common System in proportion to the total number of their staff members working in the field. The United Nations share related to the initial establishment of the fund is \$108,000.

(ii) Assistance to the Geneva Day-Care Centre:

Negotiations towards obtaining financial support from the City of Geneva, as from 1982, are proceeding actively, but in the meantime some additional financial assistance has been requested from the three organizations (International Labour Organisation (ILO), World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations) which have given continued support to the Centre. In this regard an additional assistance of \$31,800 from the United Nations is proposed.

11. Increases in the estimates of income are as follows:

Income section 1. Income from staff assessment (\$2,312,700)

Increases in income from staff assessment are estimated in respect of the effect of exchange rate changes (\$1,875,400), inflation (\$10,475,600), implementation of decision of policy-making organs (\$75,800) offset by a reduction arising from the vacancy rate in established posts, referred to in paragraph 8 above (\$10,114,100).

Income section 2. General income (\$512,100)

Adjustments relate to the impact of currency fluctuations on estimates for rental of premises and services to other agencies in Geneva; adjustments to the proportionate shares of the costs of the ICSC and JIU secretariats which are financed by other United Nations organizations, in the light of expenditure adjustments in section 28; and the impact of exchange rate fluctuations in Vienna on the proportionate shares of the costs of the Vienna International Centre to be borne by IAEA and UNRWA.

Income section 3. Revenue-producing activities (\$3,553,300)

Increases in gross revenue amounting to \$8,878,000 in respect of revenue-producing activities are offset by increases in expenses amounting to \$5,324,700 resulting in a net additional income.

Summary

12. The proposed adjustments indicated above may be summarized as follows:

In addition, a further adjustment in an amount of \$1,026,000 2/ would be required to bring the revised estimates for accommodation in the Vienna International Centre (A/C.5/35/81) in line with the rates of exchange for 1980 and 1981 as reflected in table 1 for Vienna. Hence, the total appropriations requested in this report would amount to \$47,822,800.
