STUDY ON THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN DISARMAMENT AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY

Administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution contained in document A/C.1/35/L.19

Statement submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance with rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly

1. The First Committee, at its 40th meeting held on 24 November 1980, adopted the draft resolution contained in document A/C.1/35/L.19. It had before it a statement of financial implications (A/C.1/35/L.50).

2. Under the terms of the draft resolution contained in document A/C.1/35/L.19 the General Assembly would request the Secretary-General to continue the study and to submit the final report to the General Assembly at its thirty-sixth session.

3. To carry out the continuation of the study the Secretary-General intends to appoint 10 qualified experts who would hold three sessions in 1981. One of these sessions would be held in New York and two would be held in Geneva.

4. Provided hereunder are estimated expenditures in connexion with the work of the expert group:

(a) The meetings of the group of experts would require the provision of interpretation in five languages (Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish) and translation of pre-session, in-session, and post-session documentation of a

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total volume of 650 pages. The related conference-servicing cost would be as follows: 1/ Pre-session documentation (90,000 words) \$162,700 (languages: C, E, F, R, S) Meeting servicing (languages of interpretation: C, E, F, R, S) 214,200 In-session documentation (26,500 words) 40,900 (languages: C, E, F, R, S) Post-session documentation (140,000 words) 269,000 (languages: C, E, F, R, S) 6,400 OGS requirements \$693,200 Total

(b) Based on the assumptions that the experts would be paid travel expenditures at the D-1 level and that the meetings of the expert group will last for seven weeks, the cost of the travel expenses involved would amount to approximately \$88,000.

(c) In order to assist in the preparation of the background documentation for the expert group, one consultant at P-5 level for a total period of three months will be needed. The related expenditures for fees and travel would amount to \$18,000.

(d) In addition, an amount of approximately \$12,000 will be required for travel and daily subsistence allowance of staff (one senior officer and one P-5/P-4 officer) to provide substantive services to the expert group.

5. Accordingly, total estimated expenditures resulting from the draft resolution would amount to \$811,200, \$118,000 of which relate to section 2B \$693,200 to section 29. Conference-services requirements indicated in paragraph 4 (a) and above are based on full cost, at current rates. Towards the close of the present session of the General Assembly, when the definitive pattern of conferences for 1981 is considered it will be indicated in the consolidated

statement of conference-serving requirements to what extent the costs of conference servicing dealt with in the present document can be absorbed within existing resources.

6. Consequently, should the General Assembly adopt the draft resolution contained in document A/C.1/35/L.19, the Secretary-General would request at this stage additional appropriation in a total amount of \$118,000 under section 2B of the programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981.
