WORLD DISARMAMENT CAMPAIGN

Administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution contained in document A/C.1/35/L.46

Statement submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance with rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly

- 1. The First Committee, at its 43rd meeting held on 25 November 1980, adopted the draft resolution contained in document A/C.1/35/L.46. It had before it a statement of financial implications (A/C.1/35/L.53).
- 2. Under the terms of the draft resolution contained in document A/C.1/35/L.46 of 18 November 1980, the General Assembly, having examined the relevant section of the report of the Secretary-General on the fourth and fifth sessions of the Advisory Board on disarmament studies (A/35/575), would request that the Secretary-General, with the assistance of a small group of experts, for whose composition, in so far as circumstances permit, preference should be given to members of the United Nations Secretariat, carry out a study on the organization and financing of a world disarmament campaign under the auspices of the United Nations.
- 3. To carry out the study, the Secretariat would require the assistance of three external consultants with appropriate expertise at the equivalent of P-5 level for a total period of two months each. The consultants will meet twice in New York for two weeks each time in the course of 1981, and would not require conference services.
- 4. The Centre for Disarmament would be closely involved with the carrying out of the study in areas within its competence, including co-ordination with other Secretariat units, as required.

5. Consequently, should the General Assembly adopt the draft resolution contained in document A/C.1/35/L.46, the Secretary-General would request an additional appropriation in a total amount of \$35,000 under section 2B of the programme budget for the biennium 1980-1981.
