Letter dated 28 March 1995 from the Permanent Representative of  
Croatia to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

I should like to draw your attention to the enclosed list of 51 former officers of the "Yugoslav People's Army - JNA", presently commissioned into the "Army of Yugoslavia", who have been detached on active duty to the occupied territories of Croatia. They continue to be compensated for their services by the Government of the "Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro)". In addition to the highest-ranked professional officers listed in the annex, there are approximately 6,000 other officers and petty officers commissioned in the "Army of Yugoslavia" who are detached to the general headquarters of the "Serbian Army of Krajina" and other paramilitary units in the occupied territories of Croatia; of these, there are an additional 30 colonels, 170 lieutenant colonels and 150 majors.

This is yet another confirmation of direct involvement of the Belgrade regime in the military occupation of the Republic of Croatia, as already established by the General Assembly in its resolution 49/43, and provides further evidence that the "Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro)" did not fulfil its obligation fully to withdraw the "JNA" from Croatia.

In this regard I should also like to draw your attention to Security Council resolution 871 (1993), which establishes a clear connection between the immediate demilitarization of the occupied territories and the involvement of the "Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro)" to the sanctions regime imposed on the "Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro)" in resolutions 757 (1992), 787 (1992) and 820 (1993).
