APPLICATION OF THE SLOVAK REPUBLIC FOR ADMISSION TO MEMBERSHIP IN THE UNITED NATIONS (S/25046)

The CHAIRMAN said that, at the 3155th meeting of the Security Council, held earlier that day, the President of the Security Council had decided to refer to the Committee the application of the Slovak Republic for admission to membership in the United Nations, contained in a letter dated 1 January 1993 from the Prime Minister of the Slovak Republic addressed to the Secretary-General (S/25046). The Committee was to examine the application and report back to the Council thereon.

The Secretariat had prepared a draft report, which had been distributed to the members of the Committee. Since the application of the Slovak Republic had been submitted after the opening of the forty-seventh session of the General Assembly, the Committee in its draft report recommended that the Council should apply the provision of the last paragraph of rule 60 of its provisional rules of procedure.

He took it that the Committee wished to adopt its report to the Security Council.

It was so decided.
