Letter dated 26 October 1993 from the Minister for Foreign
Affairs of Bosnia and Herzegovina addressed to the
President of the Security Council

I regret to inform you of the latest assault perpetrated over the weekend by Croat extremist forces in the village of Stupni Dol in central Bosnia.

Sources from the area report of a massacre that claimed the lives of more than 80 Muslim civilians, including women, children and elderly. It is feared that the toll may be far higher, as most residents are still unaccounted for. The whole of the village has been destroyed and there is evidence that mortars and heavy artillery were used.

Despite all of the efforts and inclination of the Government of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina to come to a durable peace agreement and to improve humanitarian conditions, unfortunately, blatant aggression, horrendous destruction of all of the country's assets, unprecedented genocide and starvation of the civilian population continue.

We urge the Security Council to take all necessary measures within its jurisdiction and as enunciated in all relevant Council resolutions to deter any further acts of aggression and wholesale slaughter of civilians.
