LETTER DATED 3 APRIL 1995 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF GREECE TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

In his statement before the Security Council, during the latter's 3512th meeting, on 31 March 1995, H.E. Mr. Denko Maleski, Permanent Representative of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia to the United Nations, used, when referring to his country, a denomination that runs counter to the provisions of Security Council resolution 817 (1993).

I would like to remind that, according to the second paragraph of the said resolution, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia has been admitted to the United Nations "being provisionally referred to for all purposes within the United Nations as 'the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia', pending settlement of the difference that has arisen over the name of the State".

I would kindly request your assistance in circulating the present letter as a document of the Security Council.
