THE SITUATION IN BURUNDI

Algeria and Burundi: draft resolution

The General Assembly,

Having considered the item entitled "The situation in Burundi",

<u>Deeply concerned</u> by the military <u>coup d'état</u> which took place in Burundi on 21 October 1993,

<u>Shocked</u> by the cowardly assassination of the President of the Republic and other political leaders,

<u>Seriously disturbed</u> by the tragic consequences of the <u>coup d'état</u> which is plunging Burundi into violence and causing loss of life and mass displacement of the population,

- 1. <u>Unreservedly condemns</u> the <u>coup</u> which has caused an abrupt and violent interruption of the democratic process initiated in Burundi;
- 2. <u>Demands</u> that the perpetrators of the putsch lay down their arms and return to their barracks;
- 3. Also demands the immediate restoration of democracy and the constitutional regime;
- 4. <u>Supports</u> the efforts being made by the Secretary-General of the United Nations, the Organization of African Unity and the countries of the region to promote a return to constitutional order and the protection of democratic institutions in Burundi;
- 5. <u>Commends</u> the Secretary-General of the United Nations for having sent a special envoy to Burundi;

- 6. <u>Requests</u> the States Members of the United Nations, international organizations, intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental organizations to provide emergency humanitarian assistance and/or any other assistance to the people of Burundi;
- 7. $\underline{\text{Decides}}$ to remain seized of the matter until a solution to the crisis is found.
