RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

48/17. <u>The situation in Burundi</u>

The General Assembly,

Having considered the item entitled "The situation in Burundi",

 $\underline{\text{Deeply concerned}}$ by the military $\underline{\text{coup d'\acute{e}tat}}$ which took place in Burundi on 21 October 1993,

 $\underline{\mathtt{Shocked}}$ by the cowardly assassination of the President of the Republic and other political leaders,

<u>Seriously disturbed</u> by the tragic consequences of the <u>coup d'état</u> which is plunging Burundi into violence, thus causing loss of life and mass displacement of the population with considerable regional repercussions,

- 1. <u>Unreservedly condemns</u> the <u>coup</u> which has caused an abrupt and violent interruption of the democratic process initiated in Burundi;
- 2. <u>Demands</u> that the perpetrators of the putsch lay down their arms and return to their barracks;
- 3. $\underline{\text{Also demands}}$ the immediate restoration of democracy and the constitutional regime;
- 4. <u>Supports</u> the efforts being made by the Secretary-General, by the Organization of African Unity and by the countries of the region to promote a return to constitutional order and the protection of democratic institutions in Burundi;
- 5. $\underline{\text{Commends}}$ the Secretary-General for having sent a special envoy to Burundi;

- 6. <u>Requests</u> the States Members of the United Nations, international organizations, intergovernmental organs and non-governmental organizations to provide emergency humanitarian assistance and/or any other assistance to the people of Burundi;
- 7. $\underline{\text{Decides}}$ to remain seized of the matter until a solution to the crisis is found.
