NOTE VERBALE DATED 26 NOVEMBER 1993 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

The Secretary-General of the United Nations presents his compliments to the President of the Security Council and, in accordance with paragraph 8 of Security Council resolution 816 (1993), has the honour to bring to his attention further information received by UNPROFOR regarding apparent violations of the ban on flights in the airspace of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Between 22 and 26 November 1993, there appear to have been seven flights of fixed- or rotary-wing aircraft in the airspace of Bosnia and Herzegovina other than those exempted in accordance with paragraph 1 of resolution 816 (1993) or approved by UNPROFOR in accordance with paragraph 2 of that resolution. Details as to the itinerary of the flights in this reporting period are attached as annex I to this note verbale.

The total number of flights assessed as apparent violations is now 1012.

Radar contact was lost when the aircraft was 7 kilometres south of Posusje. No NATO fighter aircraft were sent to investigate. 1033	23 Nov	09.05	09.12	AWACS made radar contact with an aircraft 6 kilometres south of Posusje. A NATO fighter aircraft was sent to investigate and made visual contact with a helicopter heading west. AWACS maintained radar contact while the helicopter performed a 7 kilometres arc into Croatian airspace before entering the No Fly Zone again. Radar contact was lost 6 kilometres northwest of Posusje. The unauthorized flight occurred in an area controlled by Bosnian Croats.	Various	150 knots	3,000 feet
