Elections, nominations and appointments

1. The Council will hold elections to the following bodies:

Commission on Human Settlements (E/1994/L.8)

Nineteen members are to be elected on the following basis:

Five seats for African States;
Five seats for Asian States;
Two seats for Eastern European States;
Three seats for Latin American and Caribbean States;
Four seats for Western European and other States.

Statistical Commission (E/1995/L.7)

Eight members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Two members from African States;
Two members from Asian States;

Two members from Eastern European States;

One member from Latin American and Caribbean States;

One member from Western European and other States.

Commission on Population and Development (E/1995/L.7)

Nine members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Three members from African States; Two members from Asian States; One member from Eastern European States; One member from Latin American and Caribbean States; Two members from Western European and other States.

In addition, the Council is to elect one member from African States for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring on 31 December 1997 (see, also, postponed elections).

Commission for Social Development (E/1995/L.7)

Eleven members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Two members from African States;
Two members from Asian States;
Two members from Eastern European States;
Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States;
Three members from Western European and other States.

Commission on Human Rights (E/1995/L.7)

Fourteen members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Four members from African States; Three members from Asian States; Two members from Eastern European States; Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States; Three members from Western European and other States.

Commission on the Status of Women (E/1995/L.7)

Ten members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Two members from African States;
Two members from Asian States;
One member from Eastern European States;
Three members from Latin American and Caribbean States;
Two members from Western European and other States.

Commission on Narcotic Drugs (E/1995/L.7)

Thirty-three members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Seven members from African States; Eight members from Asian States; $\underline{1}/$ Three members from Eastern European States; Six members from Latin American and Caribbean States; $\underline{2}/$ Nine members from Western European and other States.

Commission on Sustainable Development (E/1995/L.7)

Twenty members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Five members from African States;
Four members from Asian States;
Two members from Eastern European States;
Four members from Latin American and Caribbean States;
Five members from Western European and other States.

Executive Board of the United Nations Children's Fund (E/1995/L.9)

Eleven members are to be elected on the following basis:

One member from African States; Two members from Asian States; Two members from Eastern European States; Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States; Four members from Western European and other States.

Executive Committee of the Programme of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees

In accordance with General Assembly resolution 49/171, the Council is to elect three additional members of the Executive Committee, thereby increasing the membership from 47 to 50.

Executive Board of the United Nations Development Programme/United Nations Population Fund (E/1995/L.10)

Eleven members are to be elected on the following basis:

One member from African States; Two members from Asian States; Two members from Eastern European States;

 $[\]underline{1}/$ Seven seats and the seat rotating from the Latin American and Caribbean States to the Asian States.

 $[\]underline{2}/$ The seventh seat rotates from the Latin American and Caribbean States to the Asian States.

Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States; Four members from Western European and other States.

Committee on Food Aid Policies and Programmes (E/1995/L.11)

Seven members are to be elected according to the following pattern:

Two members from the States included in list A; One member from the States included in list B; One member from the States included in list C; Two members from the States included in list D; One member from the States included in list E.

2. The Council will hold nominations to the following bodies:

Committee for Programme and Coordination (E/1995/L.13)

Seven members are to be nominated, in accordance with Economic and Social Council resolution 2008 (LX) and General Assembly decision 42/450, for election by the General Assembly at its fiftieth session, to fill the vacancies in the Committee for Programme and Coordination that will occur on 31 December 1995. The term is three years, beginning on 1 January 1996. The vacancies are to be filled according to the following pattern:

Three members from African States; Three members from Asian States; One member from Latin American and Caribbean States.

World Food Council (E/1995/L.14)

In accordance with paragraph 8 of General Assembly resolution 3348 (XXIX), the Council is called upon to submit nominations to the General Assembly at its fiftieth session to fill the 12 vacancies that will occur in the World Food Council on 31 December 1995. The term is three years, beginning on 1 January 1996. On the basis of the distribution of membership in the World Food Council decided upon by the Assembly, the elections at the fiftieth session will be held according to the following pattern:

Three members from African States; Three members from Asian States; One member from Eastern European States; Two members from Latin American and Caribbean States; Three members from Western European and other States.

In addition, the Council is to nominate two members from Western European and other States, whose election was postponed by the General Assembly at its forty-ninth session, and one member from Eastern European States and one member from Western European and other States, whose election was postponed by the Assembly at its forty-eighth session (see, also, postponed elections).

3. <u>Board of Trustees of the International Training and Research Institute for the Advancement of Women</u>

In accordance with article III of the Statute of the Institute, the Board of Trustees is composed of 11 members nominated by States and appointed by the Economic and Social Council, with due regard to the fact that the Institute and its work are funded from voluntary contributions and to the principle of equitable geographical distribution. Members of the Board serve in their personal capacities for a term of three years from the date of appointment. They are eligible for reappointment by the Council for one further term.

The term of office of three members of the Board expires on 30 June 1995. Taking into account the existing de facto geographical balance of the Board, endorsed by the Council at previous sessions, the Council is to appoint one member from African States, one member from Latin American and Caribbean States and one member from Western European and other States for a three-year term, beginning on 1 July 1995.

4. The Council will also hold elections, postponed from previous sessions, for the following bodies:

Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations*

One member from African States for a period beginning on the date of election and expiring on 31 December 1998.

Commission on Population and Development

One member from African States for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring on 31 December 1997.

Commission on Science and Technology for Development*

Two members from Western European and other States for a term beginning on the date of election.

<u>Committee on New and Renewable Sources of Energy and on Energy for</u> Development*

Three members from African States for a term beginning on the date of election.

<u>Intergovernmental Working Group of Experts on International Standards of Accounting and Reporting*</u>

One member from African States for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring on 31 December 1997; two members from Latin American and Caribbean States for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring on

31 December 1997, and one member for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring on 31 December 1996.

World Food Council

Two members from Western European and other States to be nominated by the Council for election by the General Assembly, for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring on 31 December 1997; and one member from Eastern European States and one member from Western European and other States to be nominated by the Council for election by the Assembly for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring on 31 December 1996.
