3. Page 14, paragraph 54

Replace the subheading and existing text with the following:

Community organization

54. The programme aims to strengthen community capacity for assessing and analysing the causes of problems affecting children and women, taking action to solve them and managing activities supported by the national sectoral programmes. Coverage will focus on, but not be limited to, selected poor communities in the North-west and West Departments and will be complemented by activities of the sectoral programmes described above. Major strategies for community/women's empowerment, in addition to those supported by the national sectoral programmes, include (a) technical, managerial and mobilization training for and through women's groups, peasant organizations and trade unions; and (b) the establishment of modest credit schemes to develop small-scale commercial and agricultural activities to strengthen household food security. Based on the organizational, practical and legal obstacles which women encounter in carrying out empowerment activities in their communities, advocacy to eliminate those obstacles through a national policy for women will be conducted with decision makers at national and local levels. As a necessary support to empowerment at both national and community levels, the capacity of institutions and organizations that work to promote the rights and needs of women will be reinforced.

Local initiatives for children

56. This programme will strengthen municipal-level capacity for analysing and monitoring the situation of children. The strategy is to assist mayors, within the context of the Mayors as Defenders of Children initiative, in their role as local development coordinators, as well as local NGOs which carry out the bulk of service delivery activities in the communes. This strategy will include support for preparing local plans of action for children and training in sentinel site monitoring and project management and the creation, at the communal level, of a local development council including mayors offices, NGOs and local organizations. Coverage will focus on the West and North-west Departments, where the country programme will focus on community-level activities. In addition, at the national level, UNICEF will provide technical and material support to statistical institutions to facilitate monitoring of progress towards the mid-decade and year 2000 goals for children.
