## LIST OF CANDIDATES

## A. Trade union background

Mr. Sheldon FRIEDMAN (United States), Economist, Department of Economic Research, American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations (AFL-CIO). Mr. Friedman has 19 years of trade union experience. He has served in his current capacity since 1991, prior to which he served as Director of Research, United Automobile Workers. He was educated at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and has authored various publications on trade union matters.

Mr. Fackson SHAMENDA (Zambia), Chairman General of the Zambia Congress of Trade Unions. Mr. Shamenda is a prominent African trade union leader, serving as Chairman of the Southern Africa Trade Union Coordination Council (SATUCC) and on both the Steering Committee and Executive Board of the International Confederation of Free Trade Unions (ICFTU). He also serves on the Executive Board of the ICFTU African Regional Organization.

## B. Academic or other background

Ms. Lynn Krieger MYTELKA (Canada), Professor, Department of Political Science and Institute of Political Economy, Carleton University, Ottawa. Dr. Mytelka has 24 years of academic experience. She has served in her current capacity since 1982, and has also taught at the University of Paris, Yale University and Queen's University, Ontario. She holds a Ph.D from The Johns Hopkins University and has authored numerous books, mongraphs and journal articles.

Mr. Manuel R. AGOSIN (Chile), Professor of Economics at the University of Chile in Santiago. He has served in his current capacity since 1992, and has also served as adviser on international trade negotiations in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Chile. He has held positions in the past with the United Nations, including as director of research and technical assistance programmes. He holds a Ph.D from Columbia University and has published in several international journals.
