Dear Sir or Madam,

On behalf of the Commission on International Affairs I am writing to express the hope that the people of Palau in Micronesia will be given every assistance to exercise a free decision concerning their constitution.

Members of this Commission have been disturbed by reports of undue pressure being applied (especially by the United States of America and Japan) to obtain a constitution which would allow foreign military and economic interests to be asserted against the wishes of the Palauan people. It is important that every effort be made to give the Palauans control over their own affairs rather than make them dependent upon foreign patronage. The proposed constitution would appear to be a way of achieving this while still leaving room for negotiations with foreign interests over particular requests for use of land and resources.
