- 1. At its 43rd meeting, on 18 December 1993, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/48/61) on the programme budget implications of the draft resolution recommended by the Third Committee in paragraph 14 of its report (A/48/632/Add.4) under agenda item 114 (b). The related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions was presented orally by its Chairman.
- 2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of the item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/48/SR.43).

## DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, without a vote, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt the draft resolution recommended by the Third Committee in paragraph 14 of its report (A/48/632/Add.4), additional requirements of \$1,471,400 would arise under section 21, Human rights, of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1994-1995.

4. The Secretary-General is authorized to enter into all the commitments necessary within the above amount in respect of the full implementation of the activities envisaged in the draft resolution. Such additional appropriation, as may be necessary and not to exceed the amount of \$1,471,400, would be considered by the General Assembly at its resumed forty-eighth session.
