| 1. | 7.06.94 | Communication received from Mr. Colin Archer, on behalf of the Special NGO Committee for Disarmament, transmitting NGO views on the progress of the Conference on Disarmament's work on a number of its agenda items. |
| 2. | 15.07.94 | Communication received from Mr. Michael Monod, on behalf of the Geneva Peace Committee, demanding an immediate prohibition of all nuclear weapons research, production, deployment, threat and use. In addition, called for the early conclusion of a Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty, a Treaty on the prohibition of the production of fissile material for military purposes; and multilateral arrangements for "negative security assurances". |
| 3. | 25.07.94 | Communication received from the International Peace Bureau, Geneva, transmitting a combined international petition in favour of a Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty, entitled "One Million Signatures for the Definitive Stop of Nuclear Testing by July 1994". |
| 4. | 5.08.94 | Letter from Ms. J.A. Frisch, enclosing an analysis prepared by Tri-Valley CAREs, Livermore, California, USA, on the proposed National Ignition Facility (NIF), urging an agreement by the nuclear nations to forego laboratory testing. |
| 5. | 6.08.94 | Communication received from Mr. Takashi, Mayor of Hiroshima City, enclosing a "Peace Declaration", calling for the abolition of nuclear weapons and the realization of lasting world peace. |
