Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 51st meeting, on 9 December 1980, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/90) on the administrative and financial implications of draft resolution A/35/L.29. The recommendation of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions was presented orally by its Chairman.
2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/35/SR.51).

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/35/L.29, no additional appropriation would be required for the programme budget for 1980-1981. Additional conference-servicing costs not exceeding \$11,000 would arise which would be considered in the context of the consolidated statement of conference-servicing costs for 1981 to be submitted towards the close of the current session of the General Assembly.
4. Statements in explanation of position were made by the representatives of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Panama, the United States of America and Sierra Leone.
