Report of the Fifth Committee

- 1. At its 51st meeting, on 9 December 1980, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/90) on the administrative and financial implications of draft resolution A/35/L.29. The recommendation of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions was presented orally by its Chairman.
- 2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/35/SR.51).

## DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

- 3. The Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/35/L.29, no additional appropriation would be required for the programme budget for 1980-1981. Additional conference-servicing costs not exceeding \$11,000 would arise which would be considered in the context of the consolidated statement of conference-servicing costs for 1981 to be submitted towards the close of the current session of the General Assembly.
- 4. Statements in explanation of position were made by the representatives of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Panama, the United States of America and Sierra Leone.
