Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 52nd meeting, on 10 December 1980, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/107) on the administrative and financial implications of draft decision A/35/L.37/Rev.1. The recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions were presented orally to the Committee.
2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (see A/C.5/35/SR.52).

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, by a recorded vote of 70 to 6, with 12 abstentions, 1/ to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft decision A/35/L.37/Rev.1, an additional appropriation of \$519,000 would be required under section 3 of the programme budget for 1980-1981. The voting was as follows:

1/ Subsequently, the representatives of the following Member States indicated that, had they been present during the vote, they would have voted in favour of the draft decision: Bahamas, Gabon, Iran, Ivory Coast, Jordan, Kuwait, Liberia, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Mali, Oman, Pakistan, Qatar, United Arab Emirates, United Republic of Tanzania and Yemen.

In favour: Algeria, Argentina, Bahrain, Barbados, Benin, Brazil, Bulgaria, Burundi, Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Central African Republic, Chad, Chile, China, Congo, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Ecuador, Egypt, Ethiopia, Fiji, German Democratic Republic, Ghana, Guatemala, Guinea, Guyana, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Jamaica, Japan, Kenya, Madagascar, Malaysia, Mexico, Mongolia, Morocco, Mozambique, Niger, Nigeria, Peru, Philippines, Poland, Romania, Rwanda, Saudi Arabia, Senegal, Singapore, Somalia, Spain, Sudan, Swaziland, Syrian Arab Republic, Thailand, Togo, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Turkey, Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Republic of Cameroon, Upper Volta, Uruguay, Venezuela, Viet Nam, Yugoslavia, Zaire, Zambia, Zimbabwe.

Against: Australia, Canada, France, Germany, Federal Republic of, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America.

Abstaining: Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Portugal, Sweden.

4. A statement in explanation of vote was made by the representative of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, who spoke also on behalf of Canada, France, the Federal Republic of Germany and the United States of America.
