REPORT OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON ENHANCING THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PRINCIPLE OF NON-USE OF FORCE IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

Letter dated 28 October 1980 from the Permanent Representative of Chile to the United Nations addressed to the President of the General Assembly

As Chairman of the Group of Latin American States for the month of October, I have the honour to inform you that, with respect to the participation of the Latin American countries in the Special Committee on Enhancing the Effectiveness of the Principle of Non-Use of Force in International Relations, and in the event that the mandate of the Special Committee is extended, the Latin American countries have decided to continue for three more years the system of rotation which they established in 1978, likewise for three years.

Thus, it has been agreed that, in 1981, Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Cuba, Ecuador and Mexico will participate as members and Nicaragua, Panama and Peru as observers in the work of the Special Committee.

In 1982, Cuba, Ecuador, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama and Peru will participate as members and Argentina, Brazil and Chile as observers.

In 1983, the members will be Nicaragua, Panama, Peru, Argentina, Brazil and Chile and the observers will be Cuba, Ecuador and Mexico.

Thus, the system of rotation will continue as long as the Special Committee remains in existence and unless its membership is increased.
