1. At its 51st meeting, on 9 December 1980, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/94) on the administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution recommended by the Sixth Committee in paragraph 15 of its report (A/35/732). The recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions were presented orally by its Chairman.
2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/35/SR.51).

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt the draft resolution recommended by the Sixth Committee in paragraph 15 of its report (A/35/732), no additional appropriations would be required. Conference-servicing costs not exceeding \$830,700 would be considered in the context of the consolidated statement of conference-servicing costs for 1981 towards the end of the current session.
4. The representative of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics explained his position after the adoption of the decision.
