IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECLARATION ON THE GRANTING OF INDEPENDENCE TO COLONIAL COUNTRIES AND PEOPLES

Letter dated 26 February 1979 from the Permanent Representatives of France and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

In a letter of 13 April 1978 (A/33/80), we indicated to you that, during the period of full internal self-government in the New Hebrides, which began with the elections of 23 November 1977, the British and French Governments were determined to do everything in their power to facilitate a reconciliation between all the parties.

In this spirit, the two administering Powers subsequently worked out a set of proposals which M. Dijoud, French Secretary of State for Overseas Departments and Territories, presented publicly in Port-Vila in August 1978. These were, in outline, brought to the attention of Members of the United Nations in a statement made by the representative of France in the Fourth Committee on 5 December 1978 (A/C.4/33/SR.32, paras. 49-54).

We now have the pleasure to inform you that, taking into consideration the suggestions which were made, the various parties in the condominium have decided to form a Government of National Unity. This has been in place since 21 December 1978 and consists of:
