NOTE VERBALE DATED 3 FEBRUARY 1994 FROM THE PERMANENT
REPRESENTATIVE OF SINGAPORE TO THE UNITED NATIONS
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of the Republic of Singapore to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and, with reference to resolution 864 (1993) adopted by the Security Council on 15 September 1993 regarding sanctions against UNITA, has the honour to inform the Secretary-General that the following measures have been taken by the Singapore Government in order to meet the obligations of the Government of Singapore in the aforementioned resolution:

(a) A Marine Circular has been issued to Shipowners by the relevant government department.

(b) A Prohibition of Exports (Angola) Order has been issued.

Copies of the above directives are enclosed.*

The Permanent Representative further has the honour to inform the Secretary-General that in addition to the two directives above, the Singapore Government has also taken the following action:

(a) The Ministry of Defence of Singapore has instructed the Singapore Technologies companies to comply with the United Nations sanctions against the UNITA faction in Angola. The Ministry of Defence of Singapore will not endorse any request for approval to promote and sell arms-related and oil-related items to the UNITA faction and will also track companies' sales reports for any indication of promotion and sales activities in Angola. The Ministry of Home Affairs of Singapore will reject all import and export of arms and related materials of all types, including weapons and ammunition, military vehicles and equipment and spare parts from/to UNITA in Angola;

(b) The Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore (CAAS) has notified Singapore carriers, namely Singapore Airlines and SilkAir, as well as relevant aviation companies, of the contents of resolution 864.
