NOTE VERBALE DATED 18 JANUARY 1994 FROM THE PERMANENT
REPRESENTATIVE OF SINGAPORE TO THE UNITED NATIONS
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of Singapore to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General and, with reference to resolution 883 (1993) adopted by the Security Council on 11 November 1993 regarding the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, has the honour to inform the Secretary-General that the following directives have been issued by the Monetary Authority of Singapore in order to meet the obligations of the Government of Singapore as set out in the aforementioned resolution:

(a) Monetary Authority of Singapore circular No. BFIG 17/93 dated 3 December 1993;

(b) Monetary Authority of Singapore circular No. BFIG 18/93 dated 3 December 1993;

Copies of the above directives are enclosed.*

The Permanent Representative further has the honour to inform the Secretary-General that, in addition to the two directives above issued by the Monetary Authority of Singapore, the Singapore Government has also instituted the following measures:

(a) The Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore will not approve applications for scheduled or charter operations to and from the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya. The Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore will also deny clearance for flights overflying Singapore airspace to or from the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya. If the aircraft concerned refuses to comply, it would be considered as infringing our airspace and Singapore Air Force will be informed. The Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore has notified our carriers, namely Singapore Airlines and SilkAir, to comply with the resolution. The Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore has also advised Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore-approved companies that are involved in the supply of aircraft or aircraft components, as well as Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore-approved companies

providing engineering and maintenance servicing of aircraft or aircraft components, to comply with paragraph 6 (c) of the resolution;

(b) The Ministry of Defence of Singapore has instructed the Singapore Technologies companies to comply with the sanctions against the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya. The Ministry of Home Affairs of Singapore will not issue any licence for the export of arms to the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya.
