25.1 Explanations regarding the changes in respect of rates of exchange and inflation may be found in Part I of the present report and are not repeated here. Changes appearing under other changes are explained below.

<u>Posts</u>

25.2 The decreased requirements of \$1,678,600 result from a higher number of vacancies than budgeted.

Consultants and experts

25.3 The estimated savings of \$35,100 is due to postponement of some activities to the next biennium.

<u>Travel</u>

25.4 The increased travel requirements of \$17,100 are due to increased cooperation and consultations with other regional organizations and institutions and to the need to participate in a growing number of meetings resulting from

the dynamic evolution of economic cooperation in Europe, notably the processes of transition and integration.

Contractual services

25.5 The decreased requirements of \$144,400 relate to savings realized from the use of internal reproduction equipment and to delays in the completion of the publication programme budgeted for the biennium 1992-1993.
