#### PROVISIONAL AGENDA AND ANNOTATIONS

## Note by the Secretary-General

1. The eleventh session of the Committee against Torture will be held at the United Nations Office at Geneva from 8 to 19 November 1993. The first meeting of the session will be convened on Monday, 8 November 1993, at 10.30 a.m.

2. In accordance with rule 6 of the rules of procedure, the Secretary-General has prepared, in consultation with the Chairman of the Committee, the attached provisional agenda for the eleventh session. Annotations to the provisional agenda are also attached.

3. Pursuant to rule 31 of the rules of procedure, the meetings of the Committee will be held in public unless the Committee decides otherwise or it appears from the relevant provisions of the Convention that the meetings should be held in private.

4. The attention of the States parties is drawn, in particular, to the annotations to item 4, which contain the tentative timetable for the consideration of reports at the eleventh session. In accordance with rule 66 of the rules of procedure, representatives of States parties are invited to attend the meetings of the Committee when their reports are examined.

#### ANNOTATIONS

# 1. Adoption of the agenda

Under rule 8 of the rules of procedure, the first item on the agenda of any session shall be the adoption of the agenda, except for the election of officers when required under rule 15. In accordance with rule 9, during a session the Committee may revise the agenda and may, as appropriate, defer or delete items; only urgent and important items may be added to the agenda.

# 2. <u>Organizational and other matters</u>

Under this item, the Committee may wish to consider its programme of work for the session, as well as any other matter concerning the modalities of discharging its functions under the Convention. In this connection, the Committee will have before it a note by the secretariat concerning the methods of work of other treaty bodies.

# 3. <u>Submission of reports by States parties under article 19 of the</u> <u>Convention</u>

# Initial reports

In accordance with rule 65 of its rules of procedure and the Committee's decisions, the Secretary-General continued sending reminders automatically to those States parties whose initial reports were more than 12 months overdue, and subsequent reminders every 6 months. In the case of reports which were more than three years overdue, the Chairman of the Committee, at its request, discussed the question of reporting obligations with the representatives of the States parties concerned or addressed a letter on the subject to the Minister for Foreign Affairs, as appropriate.

Initial reports were due in 1988 from the 27 States parties listed in document CAT/C/5. On 24 July 1992, the Chairman of the Committee addressed a letter to the Ministers for Foreign Affairs of Togo and Uganda which had not yet submitted their initial reports due in 1988.

Under rule 65 of the rules of procedure, the Secretary-General is required to notify the Committee at each session of all cases of non-submission of reports. Accordingly, the two States parties whose initial reports were due in 1988 but had not been received as at 1 September 1993 are listed below:

In this connection, the Committee may recall that, at its seventh session, it decided to invite Togo and Uganda to submit, in one document, both

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the initial reports and the second periodic reports, which were due by 17 December 1992 and 25 June 1992, respectively. A reminder in that regard was sent by the Secretary-General on 14 July 1993.

Initial reports were due in 1989 from the 10 States parties listed in document CAT/C/7. The Chairman of the Committee, on 24 July 1992, addressed a letter to the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Guyana with regard to the submission of the initial report by that State party, which was due on 17 June 1989. The Committee at its tenth session decided to invite Guyana to submit, in one document, both the initial report and the second periodic report, which was due on 17 June 1993. A note verbale in that regard was sent by the Secretary-General on 9 June 1993. The reports of Guyana had not been received as at 1 September 1993.

The 11 States parties whose initial reports were due in 1990 are listed in document CAT/C/9. The Secretary-General, by notes verbales sent on 8 January 1993 and 5 August 1993, requested for the third or the fourth time, as appropriate, the States parties which had not yet submitted their initial reports in 1990 to do so as soon as possible. The names of the two States whose initial reports were due in 1990 but had not been received as at 1 September 1993, are given below:

In accordance with the provisions of chapter XIX of its rules of procedure, the Committee will consider under this item communications which are, or appear to be, submitted to it under article 22 of the Convention.

In accordance with article 22, paragraph 6, of the Convention and rule 101, paragraph 1, of the rules of procedure, meetings of the Committee or its subsidiary bodies during which communications under article 22 of the Convention are examined shall be closed.

## 7. <u>World Conference on Human Rights</u>

Under this item, the Committee will consider a report by its representative to the Conference. In addition, the Committee will have before it the Vienna Declaration and Programme of Action (A/CONF.157/23) and the report of the meeting of international and regional human rights treaty bodies (A/CONF.157/TBB/4 and Add.1).

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
