Note by the Secretary-General

Addendum

1. In accordance with relevant Economic and Social Council resolutions and in particular resolution 1986/35, the Commission on Human Rights, at its fiftieth session, is called upon to elect half of the Sub-Commission membership and the corresponding alternates, if any, in accordance with the following pattern: three members from African States; three members from Asian States; one member from Eastern European States; three members from Latin American States and three members from Western European and other States.

2. The Secretary-General, in documents E/CN.4/1994/85 and Add.1 and 2, informed the Commission of the nominations of candidates and alternates for election to the Sub-Commission received as at 4 February 1994. Those documents also contained the biographical data of candidates and alternates which had been received.

3. Additional nominations and biographical data have been received since 4 February 1994. The present document contains the updated list of nominations for membership of the Sub-Commission as at 16 February 1994.
