Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. By a communication dated 3 April 1995, addressed to States parties to the Statute of the International Court of Justice, the Secretary-General drew attention to the resignation of Judge Sir Robert Yewdall Jennings (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) taking effect on 10 July 1995, which will result in a vacancy in the Court. In the same communication, the Secretary-General, in accordance with Article 5, paragraph 1, of the Statute of the Court, invited the national groups of States parties to the Statute to undertake the nomination of persons in a position to accept the duties of a member of the Court. The Secretary-General further requested that nominations should be received no later than 21 June 1995.
- 2. In accordance with Article 7 of the Statute of the Court, the Secretary-General has the honour to submit to the General Assembly and to the Security Council the name of the candidate thus nominated by the national groups (see annex).
- 3. The composition of the Court and the voting procedure to be followed in the General Assembly and in the Security Council are contained in a memorandum by the Secretary-General issued as document A/49/931-S/1995/527. The curriculum vitae of the candidate appears in document A/49/933-S/1995/529.
