<u>Letter dated 22 August 1995 from the Permanent Representative of</u> Slovenia to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

With reference to the letter of the "Permanent Mission of Yugoslavia" (A/50/350-S/1995/689), I wish to recall that the Security Council stated, in its resolution 777 (1992) of 19 September 1992, inter alia:

" $\underline{\text{Considering}}$ that the State formerly known as the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia has ceased to exist,

" . . .

"Considers that the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) cannot continue automatically the membership of the former Socialist Republic of Yugoslavia in the United Nations, and therefore recommends to the General Assembly that it decide that the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) should apply for membership in the United Nations and that it shall not participate in the work of the General Assembly."

This requirement is clear. All the attempts by the "Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro)" to present itself as a Member of the United Nations are thus out of order.
