NOTE VERBALE DATED 21 OCTOBER 1993 FROM THE PERMANENT MISSION OF SWEDEN TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Mission of Sweden to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and, with reference to paragraph 24 of Security Council resolution 864 (1993), has the honour to provide him with the following information.

On 30 September 1993, the Swedish Government issued an Ordinance (1993:1061) on Sanctions related to the situation in Angola. The Ordinance entered into force on 7 October 1993.

Under the ordinance, the following provisions were issued in order to fulfil Sweden's obligations according to Security Council resolution 864 (1993), which aims at preventing the sale or supply of military equipment and petroleum and petroleum products to the National Union for the Total Independence of Angola (UNITA) (sect. 1). Military equipment and related equipment refers to equipment listed in the appendix to the Military Equipment Ordinance (1992:1303) (sect. 2). Military equipment and related equipment as well as petroleum and petroleum products may not be imported into Angola (sect. 4). Following a decision by the Government of Sweden, military equipment and related equipment, as well as petroleum and petroleum products, may be imported into Angola through points of entry notified by the Secretary-General (sect. 5).
