## NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

At its 63rd plenary meeting on 14 November 1980, the General Assembly adopted resolution 35/32," entitled "Adverse consequences for the enjoyment of human rights of political, military, economic and other forms of assistance given to colonial and racist régimes in southern Africa". In paragraph 5 of that resolution the General Assembly

"<u>Requests</u> the Security Council urgently to consider complete and mandatory sanctions under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations against the racist régime of South Africa, in particular:

"(a) The prohibition of all technological assistance or collaboration in the manufacture of arms and military supplies in South Africa;

"(b) The cessation of all collaboration with South Africa in the nuclear field;

"(c) The prohibition of all loans to, and all investments in, South Africa and the cessation of any trade with South Africa;

"(d) An embargo on the supply of petroleum, petroleum products and other strategic commodities to South Africa."
