SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS  
OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE  
STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/1994/20 of 20 January 1994, S/1994/20/Add.3 of 3 February 1994, S/1994/Add.12 of 8 April 1994 and S/1994/20/Add.14 of 21 April 1994.

During the week ending 7 May 1994 the Security Council took action on the following items:

An agenda for peace: preventive diplomacy, peacemaking and peace-keeping (see S/23370/Add.26, S/23370/Add.43, S/25070, S/25070/Add.4, S/25070/Add.8, S/25070/Add.13, S/25070/Add.17 and S/25070/Add.21; see also S/23370/Add.4)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3372nd meeting, held on 3 May 1994, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on improving the capacity of the United Nations for peace-keeping (S/26450 and Add.1 and Corr.1 and Add.2).

The President stated that, following consultations among members of the Security Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the full text, see S/PRST/1994/22; to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Forty-ninth Year, Resolutions and decisions of the Security Council, 1994).

Agreement signed on 4 April 1994 between the Governments of Chad and the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya concerning the practical modalities for the implementation of the Judgment delivered by the International Court of Justice on 3 February 1994 (see S/1994/20/Add.14; see also S/15560/Add.12, S/15560/Add.13, S/15560/Add.14, S/15560/Add.31, S/15560/Add.32, S/15560/Add.33, S/15560/Add.35, S/16880/Add.4 and S/17725/Add.46)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3373rd meeting, held on 4 May 1994, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General concerning the agreement on the implementation of the Judgment of the International Court of Justice concerning the territorial dispute between Chad and the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya (S/1994/512).

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1994/532), that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council then proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1994/532 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 915 (1994) (for the full text, see S/RES/915 (1994); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Forty-ninth Year, Resolutions and decisions of the Security Council, 1994).

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1994/538), that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council then proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1994/538 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 916 (1994) (for the full text, see S/RES/916 (1994); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Forty-ninth Year, Resolutions and decisions of the Security Council, 1994).

The question concerning Haiti (see S/25070/Add.24 and Corr.1, S/25070/Add.34, S/25070/Add.35, S/25070/Add.37, S/25070/Add.38, S/25070/Add.41, S/25070/Add.43, S/25070/Add.46, S/1994/20/Add.1 and S/1994/20/Add.11; see also S/22110/Add.39)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3376th meeting, held on 6 May 1994, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Canada, Haiti and Venezuela, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1994/541), that had been submitted by Argentina, Canada, France, the United States of America and Venezuela and made oral revisions to the text of the draft resolution (S/1994/541) in its provisional form.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1994/541, as orally revised in its provisional form, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 917 (1994) (for the full text, see S/RES/917 (1994); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Forty-ninth Year, Resolutions and decisions of the Security Council, 1994).
