#### ELECTIONS, NOMINATIONS AND CONFIRMATIONS

### <u>Election of seven members of the Committee on Food Aid</u> Policies and Programmes

#### Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. At its resumed organizational session for 1994, the Economic and Social Council will be called upon to elect seven members of the Committee on Food Aid Policies and Programmes, for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 1995, to fill the vacancies created by the expiration on 31 December 1994 of the terms of the following members: Colombia, Cuba, Ethiopia, Ghana, Norway, Syrian Arab Republic and United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. The membership of the Committee in 1994 is given in annex I below.
- 2. In accordance with the criteria set out in General Assembly resolution 46/22, the members are to be elected from the States included in lists A to E set out in appendix A to the report of the Committee on the work of its first special session (E/1991/69). The lists have been updated to take into account new members of the United Nations (see annex II below). The seven members will therefore be elected according to the following pattern:

Two members from the States included in list A;

One member from the States included in list B;

Two members from the States included in list C;

Two members from the States included in list D.
