Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents $S / 1995 / 40$ of 16 January 1995, S/1995/40/Add. 2 of 25 January 1995 and S/1995/40/Add. 14 of 21 April 1995.

During the week ending 2 September 1995, the Security Council took action on the following item:

The situation in Burundi (see S/25070/Add.43, S/25070/Add.46, S/1994/20/Add.29, S/1994/20/Add.33, S/1994/20/Add.41, S/1994/20/Add.50, S/1995/40/Add.4, S/1995/40/Add. 9 and S/1995/40/Add.12)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3571st meeting, held on 28 August 1995, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it a letter dated 28 July 1995 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/1995/631).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Burundi, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1995/724), which had been submitted by Argentina, the Czech Republic, France, Germany, Honduras, Italy, the Russian Federation, Rwanda, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1995/724 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1012 (1995) (for the full text, see S/RES/1012 (1995); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fiftieth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1995).
