Report of the Fifth Committee

- 1. At its 51st meeting, on 9 December 1980, the Fifth Committee considered the statement submitted by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/95) on the administrative and financial implications of draft resolution I recommended by the Third Committee (A/35/721, para. 28). The recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions were expressed orally by its Chairman.
- 2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's discussion of this question are reflected in the summary record of the meeting (A/C.5/35/SR.51).

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

- 3. The Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution I recommended by the Third Committee (A/35/721, para. 28), no additional appropriation would be required. Conference-servicing costs not exceeding \$192,200 would be taken into account in the context of the consolidated statement of total conference-servicing costs to be submitted to the General Assembly towards the end of the current session.
- 4. The representatives of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Canada and Spain explained their positions after the decision.
