## Report of the Fifth Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Carl C. PEDERSEN (Canada)

- 1. At its 52nd meeting, on 10 December 1980, the Fifth Committee considered the statement submitted by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/67) on the administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution recommended by the Third Committee in paragraph 11 of its report (A/35/634). The Committee also had before it the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/35/7/Add.25).
- 2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's discussion of this question are reflected in the summary record of the meeting (A/C.5/35/SR.52).

## DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt the draft resolution recommended by the Third Committee in paragraph 11 of its report (A/35/634), an additional appropriation of \$386,200 would be required, broken down as follows:

Section 4	(Policy-making organs (economic and social activities))	241,600
Section 8	(Office of Secretariat Services for Economic and Social Matters)	3,600
Section 27	(Public information)	119,900
Section 28	(Administration, management and general services)	21,100
	Total	386,200

In addition, an appropriation of \$51,100 would be required under section 31 (Staff assessment), to be offset by an equivalent amount under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment). Conference-servicing costs not exceeding \$451,700 would be taken into account in the context of the consolidated statement of total conference-servicing costs to be submitted to the General Assembly towards the end of the current session.
