1. At its 55th meeting, on 11 December 1980, the Fifth Committee considered the statement submitted by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/35/98) on the administrative and financial implications of draft resolution II recommended by the Third Committee in paragraph 30 of its report (A/35/742). The recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions were presented orally by its Chairman.
2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's discussion of this question are reflected in the summary record of the meeting (A/C.5/35/SR.55).

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution II recommended by the Third Committee in paragraph 30 of its report (A/35/742), an additional appropriation of \$70,000 would be required for temporary assistance in 1981 under section 6 of the programme budget. An associated requirement of \$17,500 for staff assessment under section 31 of the programme budget would be offset by an equivalent increase in income under income section 1 of the programme budget.
4. The representative of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics explained his position after the adoption of the decision.
