> DRAFTING OF AN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION AGAINST THE RECRUITMENT, USE, FINANCING AND TRAINING OF MERCENARIES

Appointment of a member of the Ad Hoc Committee on the Drafting of an International Convention against the Recruitment, Use, Financing and Training of Mercenaries

Note by the Secretary-General

1. Further to his communication of 15 January 1981 (see A/35/793, para. 2), the President of the General Assembly, on 10 February 1981, informed the Secretary-General, on the basis of a letter addressed to him by the Chairman of the Latin American Group, that Panama had withdrawn from the <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee on the Drafting of an International Convention against the Recruitment, Use, Financing and Training of Mercenaries in favour of Cuba, that Cuba's candidature had been endorsed by the Latin American Group and that, in accordance with the principle of rotation agreed upon within the Group, Uruguay had become an official enadidate of the Group for membership in the <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee and Cuba would this year replace Uruguay as an observer. The President further informed the Secretary-General that, taking duly into account the nomination of the Latin American Group, he had appointed Uruguay to replace Panama as a member of the <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee.

2. As a result, the <u>Ad Hoc</u> Committee on the Drafting of an International Convention against the Recruitment, Use, Financing and Training of Mercenaries is now composed of the following 33 Member States:
