NOTE VERBALE DATED 5 JULY 1994 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

The Secretary-General of the United Nations presents his compliments to the President of the Security Council and, in accordance with paragraph 8 of Security Council resolution 816 (1993), has the honour to bring to his attention further information received by UNPROFOR regarding apparent violations of the ban on flights in the airspace of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Between 01-04 July 1994, there appears to have been 10 flights of fixed or rotary-wing aircraft in the airspace of Bosnia and Herzegovina other than those exempted in accordance with paragraph 1 of resolution 816 (1993) or approved by UNPROFOR in accordance with paragraph 2 of that resolution. Details as to the itinerary of flights in this reporting period are attached as annex I to this note verbale.

Please note that the total number of flights reported in note verbale S/1994/5/Add.44 should have read 1,759.

The total number of flights assessed as apparent violations is now 1,769.

1784	01 July	10.50	10.51	UNPROFOR personnel observed a green Gazelle helicopter with red cross markings flying above Brcko. The unauthorized flight of this helicopter took place in an area controlled by Bosnian Serbs.	East-South-east 150 feet Slow
1785	02 July	11.57	11.58	UNPROFOR personnel observed a white helicopter, possibly a MI8 with blue stripes on the tail, on the ground, 1 kilometre north of Tarcin. The helicopter took off and flew north-west. The unauthorized flight of this helicopter took place in an area controlled by the Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina.	North-west Low Slow
1786	02 July	12.14	12.15	UNPROFOR personnel observed a white helicopter land at Zenica and take-off 5 minutes later. The unauthorized flight of this helicopter took place in an area controlled by the Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina.	North Low Slow
1787	02 July	12.58	16.58	The flight began as an approved MEDEVAC, but became a violation when it transported 4 unauthorized passengers from Posusje to Kiseljak. It subsequently transported 3 unauthorized passengers (leaving 3 patients) to Split and 3 unauthorized passengers from Split to Posusje. The unauthorized flight of this helicopter took place in an area controlled by Bosnian Croats.	North-east, south-west and south-east Low Slow
1788	02 July	13.45	13.46	UNPROFOR personnel observed a green helicopter with a black cross 13 kilometres south-east of Tarcin. The unauthorized flight of this helicopter took place in an area controlled by the Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina.	South-west 50 feet above trees Slow
1789	02 July	18.20	18.25	AWACs made radar contact and NATO fighter aircraft made visual contact on a MI8 helicopter 10 kilometres south-east of Zenica, the helicopter landed at Zenica. The unauthorized flight of this helicopter took place in an area controlled by the Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina.	North-west 2200 feet 80 knots
