NOTE VERBALE DATED 10 JUNE 1994 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

The Secretary-General of the United Nations presents his compliments to the President of the Security Council and, in accordance with paragraph 8 of Security Council resolution 816 (1993), has the honour to bring to his attention further information received by the United Nations Protection Force (UNPROFOR) regarding apparent violations of the ban on flights in the airspace of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Between 7 and 9 June 1994, there appear to have been 15 flights of fixed- or rotary-wing aircraft in the airspace of Bosnia and Herzegovina other than those exempted in accordance with paragraph 1 of resolution 816 (1993) or approved by UNPROFOR in accordance with paragraph 2 of that resolution. Details as to the itinerary of flights in this reporting period are attached as annex I to this note verbale.

The total number of flights assessed as apparent violations is now 1,711.

NATO fighter aircraft were sent to investigate and made visual contact on a grey MI-8 helicopter. The helicopter landed at the football field at Posusje. The helicopter took off again at 09.10 heading north-east which corresponds to the take off time of an approved MEDEVAC flight from Posusje to Nova Bila and return. This entire flight was a violation as the helicopter flew unauthorized to Posusje and UNPROFOR personnel observed 9 unauthorized personnel boarding the helicopter. The unauthorized flight of this helicopter took place in an area controlled by Bosnian Croats.	Various Low Slow		
1724	08 Jun	08.20	13.10	The flight began as an approved MEDEVAC flight from Pale to Zvornik and return. The flight became a violation when the helicopter deviated from the approved routing flying to Belgrade and returning to Pale two and a half hours late. The unauthorized flight of this helicopter took place in an area controlled by Bosnian Serbs.	North-east Low Slow		
1725	08 Jun	09.30	09.40	NATO fighter aircraft made visual contact on a MI-8 helicopter flying 10 kilometres north of Mostar. After verbal warnings were issued by aircraft fighters, the helicopter landed 15 kilometres south-east of Prozor. The unauthorized flight of this helicopter took place in an area controlled by the Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina.	North Low Slow		
1726	08 Jun	10.31	10.50	AWACs made radar contact on a helicopter 3 kilometres south-west of Zaluzani (a helipad 10 kilometres north of Banja Luka). The aircraft was slow moving and continued to manoeuvre within a small area. Radar contact was finally lost 6 kilometres southwest of Zaluzani. The unauthorized flight of this helicopter took place in an area controlled by Bosnian Serbs.	Various Low 50 knots
