## The role of science and technology in the context of international security, disarmament and other related fields

## The General Assembly,

<u>Recalling</u> its previous resolutions on the subject of the role of science and technology in the context of international security, disarmament and other related fields, in which, <u>inter alia</u>, it recognized that scientific and technological developments could have both civilian and military applications and that progress in science and technology for civilian applications needed to be maintained and encouraged,

<u>Recognizing</u> the importance of continued multilateral dialogue on means of promoting the transfer of technology for peaceful purposes while ensuring that such technology is not diverted to non-peaceful purposes,

1. <u>Invites</u> Member States to enhance bilateral and multilateral dialogue on the role of science and technology in the context of international security, disarmament and other related fields with a view to:

(a) Ensuring implementation of relevant commitments already undertaken under international legal instruments;

(b) Exploring ways and means of further developing international legal rules on transfers of high technology with military applications;

2. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its fifty-first session the item entitled "The role of science and technology in the context of international security, disarmament and other related fields".
