NOTE VERBALE DATED 15 JULY 1994 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

The Secretary-General presents his compliments to the President of the Security Council and, in accordance with paragraph 8 of Security Council resolution 816 (1993), has the honour to bring to his attention further information received by the United Nations Protection Force (UNPROFOR) regarding apparent violations of the ban on flights in the airspace of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Between 12 and 14 July 1994, there appear to have been four flights of fixed- or rotary-wing aircraft in the airspace of Bosnia and Herzegovina other than those exempted in accordance with paragraph 1 of resolution 816 (1993) or approved by UNPROFOR in accordance with paragraph 2 of that resolution. Details as to the itinerary of flights in this reporting period are annexed to the present note verbale.

The total number of flights assessed as apparent violations is now 1,791.

The unauthorized flight took place in an area controlled by the Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina.	East 100 knots 1,000 feet
1811	12 July	1228	1229	UNPROFOR personnel observed a white Mi8 helicopter with blue stripes and a red cross take off from Zenica. The helicopter continued to the south. The unauthorized flight took place in an area controlled by the Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina.	South Slow Low
1812	13 July	1028	1029	UNPROFOR personnel observed a white Mi8 helicopter with blue stripes and a red cross overflying Zenica. The unauthorized flight took place in an area controlled by the Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina.	South-east Slow Low
1813	14 July	0905	1215	The flight began as an approved medical evacuation from Pale to Zvornik, but became a violation when the helicopter departed Zvornik on time but returned to Pale over two hours later than the approved time. The unauthorized flight took place in an area controlled by Bosnian Serbs.	? Slow Low
