SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF
WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE
REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/1995/40 of 16 January 1995, S/1995/40/Add.2 of 25 January 1995, S/1995/40/Add.14 of 21 April 1995 and S/1995/40/Add.39 of 11 October 1995.

During the week ending 11 November 1995, pursuant to a note by the Secretary-General dated 1 November 1995 (S/1995/914) and in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, the Security Council, at its 3590th meeting, held on 7 November 1995, met to consider the date of an election to fill a vacancy in the International Court of Justice as a result of the death of Judge André Aguilar Mawdsley (Venezuela).

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1995/928) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council adopted draft resolution S/1995/928 without a vote as resolution 1018 (1995) (for the text, see S/RES/1018 (1995); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fiftieth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1995).

Also during the week ending 11 November 1995, the Security Council took action on the following other items:

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3589th meeting, held on 6 November 1995 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited Mr. Vladislav Jovanovic, at his request.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution submitted by Argentina, the Czech Republic, France, Germany, Italy, the Russian Federation, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America (S/1995/940).

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1995/940 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1019 (1995) (for the text, see S/RES/1019 (1995); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fiftieth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1995).

The situation in Liberia (see S/22110/Add.3 and Corr.1, S/23370/Add.18, S/23370/Add.46, S/25070/Add.12, S/25070/Add.23, S/25070/Add.32, S/25070/Add.38, S/1994/20/Add.15, S/1994/20/Add.20, S/1994/20/Add.27, S/1994/20/Add.36, S/1994/20/Add.41, S/1995/40/Add.1, S/1995/40/Add.14, S/1995/40/Add.25 and S/1995/40/Add.36)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3592nd meeting, held on 10 November 1995 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the thirteenth progress report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Observer Mission in Liberia (S/1995/881 and Add.1).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Liberia, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1995/923) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1995/923 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1020 (1995) (for the text, see S/RES/1020 (1995); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fiftieth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1995).
